Implicit Bias

Thoughts and feelings of which people are unaware, including unconscious preferences or aversions.

- This conversation is open-ended and may not come to resolution



What Is a Talking Circle?



"A Talking Circle, sometimes called a Peacemaking Circle, uses a structural framework to build relationships and to address conflict within a community. But Talking Circles serve other purposes as well: They create safe spaces, build connections and offer teachers a unique means of formative assessment."

Restorative Circle


