

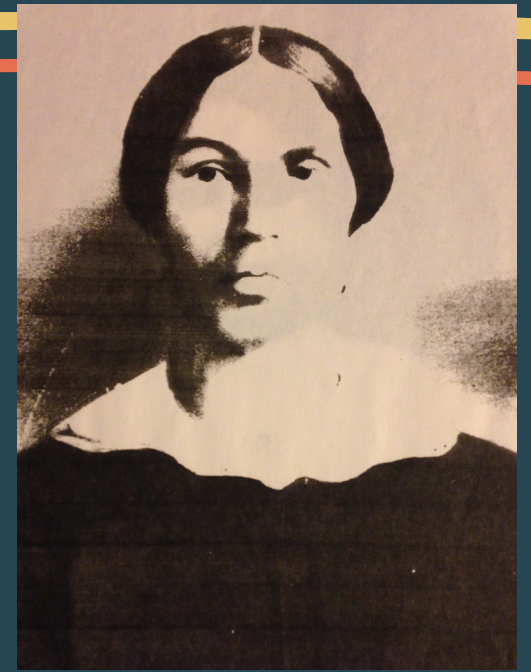


The Hidden History of Mount Peace Cemetery

Overview



This presentation will give an overview and includes profiles of the prominent people buried in Mount Peace Cemetery in Lawnside, New Jersey. From barbers, to preachers, teachers, musicians to veterans, Mount Peace Cemetery has interred many African Americans whose contributions have been long forgotten. The purpose of this presentation and upcoming tours are to educate, engage and inspire the public on the "hidden history" that is buried in our 11.5-acre historic site.

PLOT PURCHASED FOR NEW NEGRO BURYING GROUNDS

The Mt. Peace Cemetery Association, organized two years ago, by prominent colored men of this city, has purchased an eighteen-acre tract of land on the White Horse pike near Lawnside, where they propose establishing a cemetery.

A new burying ground for colored people is needed as the Johnson cemetery on the East Side is fast filling up.

John Henry Lawson- 1837-1919/ Landsman U.S. Navy is the recipient of the Medal of Honor for his bravery at the Battle of Mobile Bay. Upon being wounded by shell fire on USS Hartford, Lawson remained at his post and continued to supply the ship's ammunition despite the fact that the majority of his crew was injured and mortally wounded.

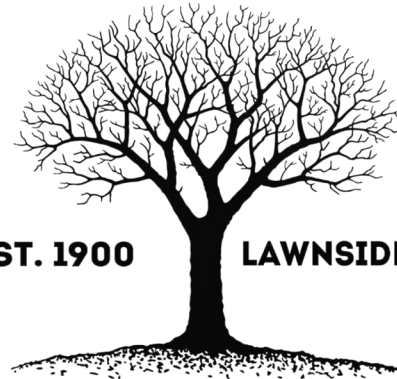
