
Stockton's Glynn County, Georgia Plantation

Previously known:

- In 1828, Robert Stockton purchased land near Turtle River in Glynn County, GA for the creation of a sugarcane plantation.
- Two years later, the 1830 census records Robert Field Stockton as owning 108 individuals, 39 under the age of 10.
- The next census shows that Stockton no longer owned this land.

What we wanted to know:

- ♦ Who were these 108 people?
- What was the fate of the plantation and all of the enslaved held there?

Interstate movement of enslaved...

- Congress outlawed the importation of African slaves in 1808.
- They were shuttled between Charleston, Savannah, Philadelphia, and New York.
- Enslaved people owned by Commodore Stockton and the Potters were shipped domestically at least 70 times.
