LALDEF: Early days

- **2004**: Concerned Mercer County residents see the additional stress and marginalization on immigration communities **after 9/11**
- Form volunteer, community-based, non-funded coalition to address these issues
- Anne Reeves (Arts Council of Princeton), Ryan Lilienthal (immigration attorney), Ann Yasuhara, representatives from Princeton Friends Meeting





LALDEF: Early days

- One of first efforts was Community ID Cards in Princeton
- “When a Princeton resident was unable to get dialysis treatment from the hospital and a local mother was prohibited from buying over-the-counter cough medicine for her sick child, [it was] because they did not have proper ID” (*The Princeton Sun*, 2014).





LALDEF: Expansion to Trenton

- By 2008...
- Open up to Trenton through healthcare initiatives...
- Then FUTURO...
- First community center on Chambers Street in 2013





LALDEF: Expansion to Trenton

- Permanent residence allowed for -
- Expansion of ID card program

LALDEF: broad shifts

- Beyond Latin American communities (e.g., Haitian)
- Beyond Spanish language services (e.g., Haitian Creole)
- Expansion to work with community partners (solidarity- and coalition-building)





LALDEF: Today

- Increased fear, anxiety, invisibility
- Increased vigilance and security
- We continue to serve our community with strength and dignity





LALDEF: Today

- More clients requesting different services (e.g., creation of Power of Attorney to prepare for detention and/or deportation)
- More restrictions (e.g., harder citizenship test)
- More people in need of services
- Focus on educating clients to mitigate fear-based reactions

LALDEF's Immigration Legal Services department is dedicated to supporting immigrants in Mercer County as they navigate the pathway to permanent status in the United States. Amidst a rapidly-changing immigration client, LALDEF remains committed to ensuring that the most vulnerable members of our community know their rights and can access quality, low-cost legal services.

Mercer County Community ID Cards

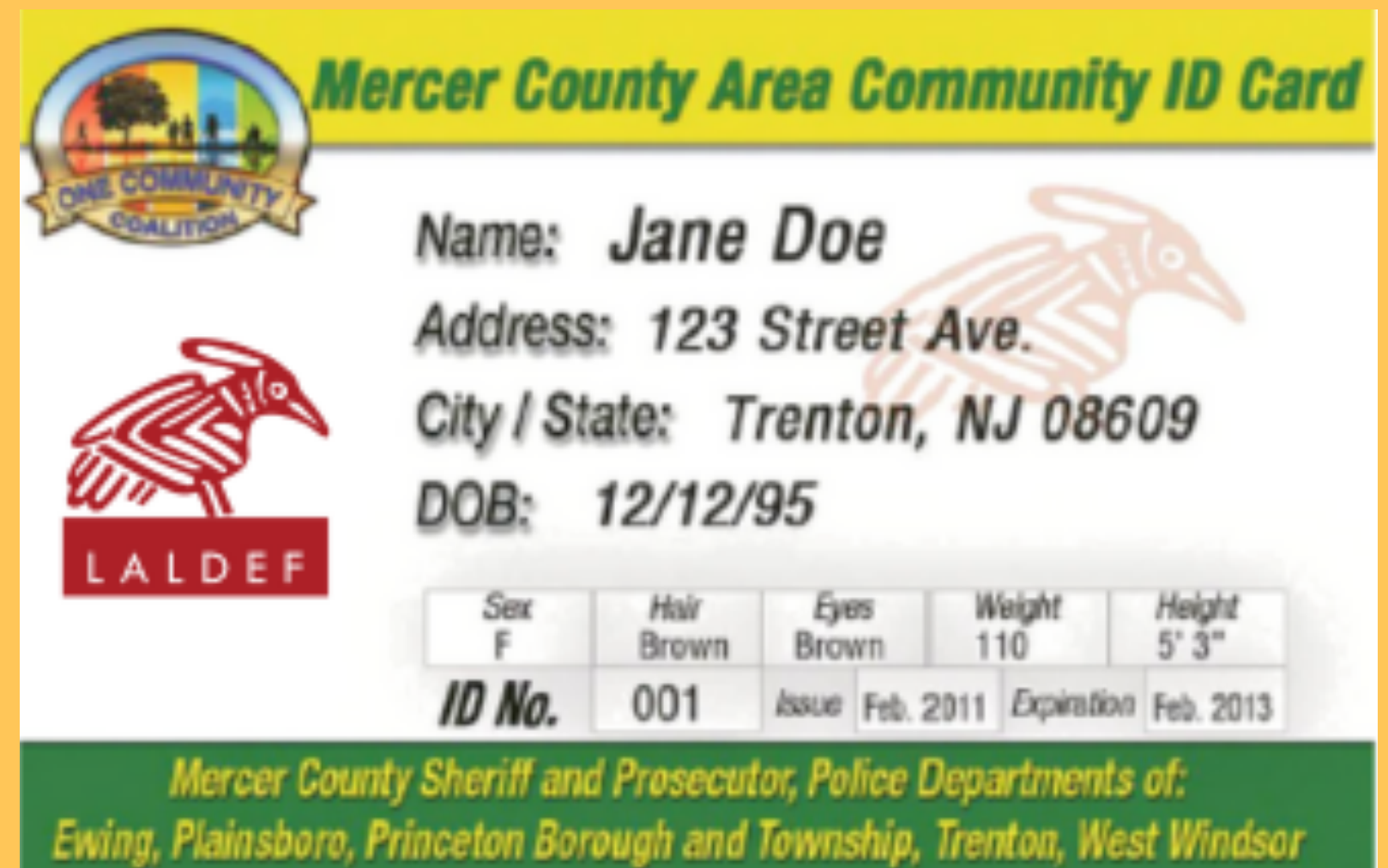
Mercer County Community Identification Cards



The Mercer County Area Community ID Card extends to the cardholder the ability to prove both identity and residency in the County. It only requires proof of address and other identification.

This ID card may be used at places such as:

- Police Stations
- Public libraries
- Public schools
- Certain banks, pharmacies, or stores



In 2025, LALDEF issued **1,882 Mercer County Community IDs**, serving as a trusted gateway for individuals to access vital services.

The Community ID program offers residents of Mercer County the opportunity to identify themselves, prove their address, and have an emergency contact on file at all times.

The community ID cards provide access to services at locations such as:

- **Municipal and social service agencies**
- **Schools**
- **Clinics**
- **Food pantries**
- **Parks**
- **Post offices**
- **Libraries**

The Mercer County Community ID program was launched in 2011 through the **One Community Coalition** after identifying the many obstacles that members of our community without identification faced. LALDEF partners with organizations such as the **Trenton Area Soup Kitchen (TASK)**, the **Rescue Mission of Trenton**, and the **Trenton Psychiatric Hospital** to provide IDs to any underserved population in need of identification.



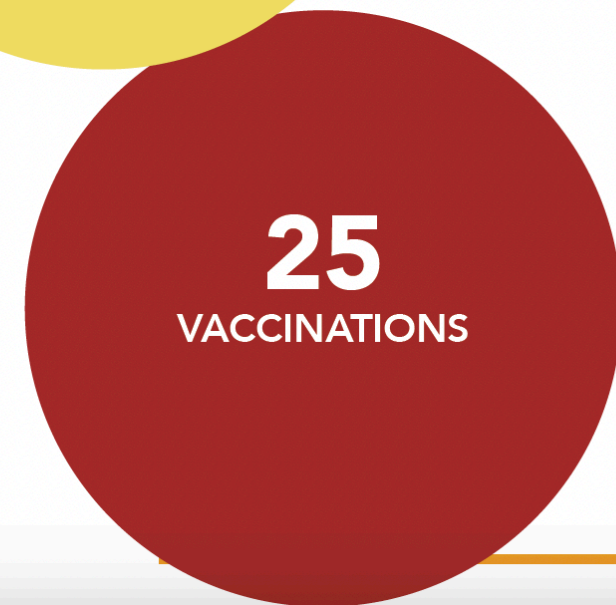
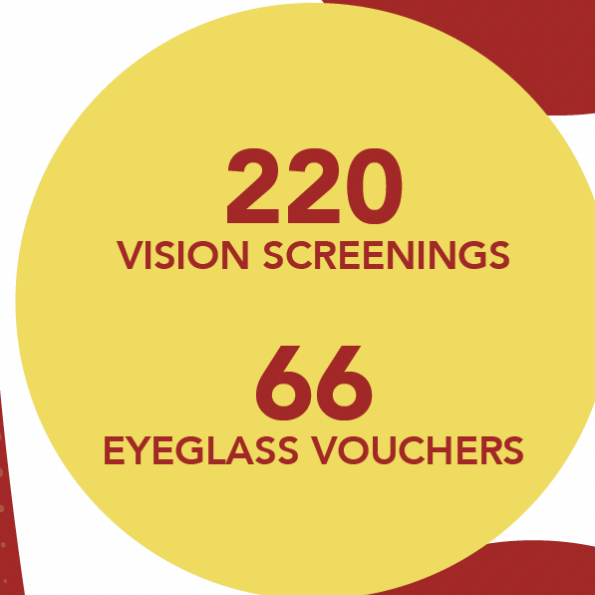
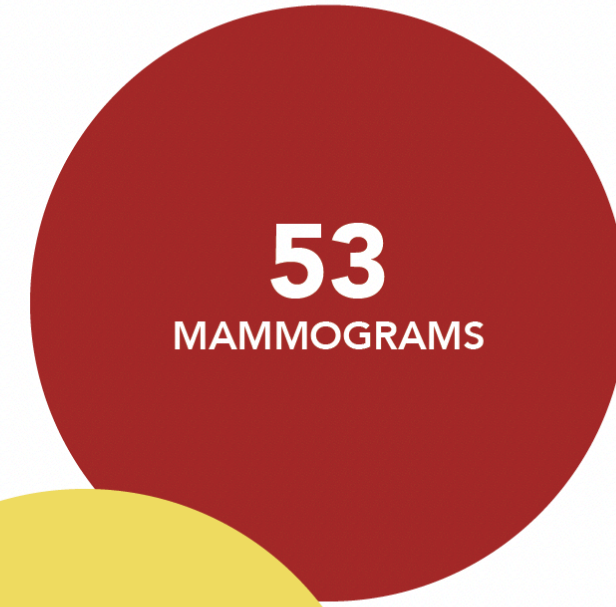
Promote equitable healthcare

LALDEF is committed to providing low-income immigrants in Mercer County, NJ with equitable, culturally and linguistically accessible healthcare resources. Through our free healthcare initiatives, we have been able to combat the barriers, fears, and misinformation which has historically led to poorer health outcomes for the Latino community, including higher mortality rates.

In 2025, LALDEF hosted its annual Hispanic Heritage Month Wellness and Resource Fair, as well as 220 vision screenings, 66 eyeglass vouchers, 53 mammograms, and 25 vaccinations.

MAMMOGRAM EXTRAVAGANZA EVENT

In 2025, LALDEF teamed up with the Trenton Health Team's NJCEED program to provide semi-annual mammogram screenings.

These events provided free mammograms to 53 women who reported a family history of breast cancer or who were ages 40 years and older.

At the event, clients also had the opportunity to connect with healthcare providers to schedule other types of cancer screenings.

FREE EYE SCREENINGS

LALDEF, in collaboration with **Project BEST**, continued its free eye screening program throughout 2025. This program provides community members with free eye exams; we have also been able to provide referrals to free glasses for those in need of financial assistance. **This year, 220 community members participated in free eye screenings at LALDEF's headquarters, and 66 individuals were referred for free eyeglasses.** This program is offered on the last Monday of each month.



Client Advocacy

LALDEF's Client Advocates provide our community with hands-on assistance to navigate a variety of concerns, including identification, unemployment, food stamps, housing, and other vital social services.

Advocacy

Our advocacy services include:

- Translations of documents in English and Spanish
- Notarizations
- Referrals and information about other services in Trenton, as needed
- Assistance applying for different social services in Mercer County, such as SNAP and NJ FamilyCare

Adult Education

Adult Education

LALDEF commits itself to helping clients to achieve and perfect the necessary abilities for self-sufficiency. Classes include: **ESL, GED and Citizenship Classes.** In January of 2026, LALDEF began offering a virtual Spanish class for professionals.

In addition, LALDEF has a contract with Mercer County to serve referred One-Stop Career Center clients with ESL courses and community work experience hours.



LALDEF's Adult Education program enhances client quality of life by providing empowerment through education. Our expansive catalogue of course offerings equips our clients with greater knowledge of the English language, leading to improved outcomes in education, employment, and more. Our GED courses play a key role in advancing and furthering client education, while our citizenship courses equip future citizens with the knowledge and skills needed to pass the U.S. Citizenship and Immigration Services (USCIS) citizenship exam.

"I am from Venezuela, and I moved to the USA in 2020. I did not speak English. I arrived in New Jersey in 2022 and I have one year studying English. I live with my brother here in New Jersey.

My experience with LALDEF has been positive. ESL classes have helped me. I can express myself better and I understand more. I felt welcome at LALDEF and the organization [is] helping people like me."

LALDEF's Latinas Unidas program is a support group for Latina women in the Mercer County community. Latinas Unidas members have the opportunity to share and learn about a number of topics relevant to women today, including healthcare, education, financial literacy, and more. In addition to hands-on workshops and educational opportunities, the Latinas Unidas program provides participants with a forum to share resources, goals, and dreams with a community of supportive, like-minded women.

Worker's Rights in NJ



1

Earned Sick Leave

Employers of all sizes must provide full-time, part-time, and temporary employees with up to 40 hours of earned sick leave per year so they can care for themselves or a loved one.

2

Temporary Disability Insurance

This program provides cash benefits to New Jersey workers who have to stop working due to a physical or mental health condition or other disability unrelated to their work.

3

Family Leave Insurance

This program provides cash benefits to New Jersey workers who are unable to work because they need to care for a family member with a physical or mental health condition, bond with a newborn, newly adopted or newly placed foster child, or handle certain matters related to domestic or sexual violence.

4

Unemployment Insurance

Unemployment Insurance (UI) is a program that gives financial support to people who lose their jobs through no fault of their own and are based on wage information from your employers in the last 18 months.
